#### LOOKING AHEAD

Pastoral Care Changes

Our biblical conviction is that we want each of our members to be engaged and valued in the life of the church. In the last year we have been taking significant time to reflect on our pastoral care structures. We have been seeking the Lord in this and have not made any quick decisions. In the coming weeks, you will hear from us regarding some changes we would like to make regarding care, so that we might best serve our fellowship.

Sunday Evenings

In the last year we have re-established evening services, though not yet on a weekly basis. We're encouraged by the attendance at monthly evening communion services. We have tried something different with our 'Gospel Shaped Worship' series in recent months. This has been a good course that gives us a good basis for reflection for evening services going forward. Evening services are high on the agenda for our early conversations as Craig would take up post.

### **PRAYER POINTS**

• The integration of newcomers

This past year has seen many new folks come through our doors. There have been different reasons people have joined. Please pray for us and our deacons as we would seek to integrate newcomers, especially as we would explore baptism and membership with individuals.

Adding to our eldership

This is an important point for prayer. The three of us have been really stretched in this last year. We recognise that to serve the church well we could do with a wider eldership. Pray that the Lord would be raising up brothers from amongst us and that we might see our team widened with capable men.

• For endurance and strength as we seek to shepherd the fellowship

This has been a tiring year! The three of us feel that. There have been real joys and some real challenges in this last year. We aim "to present everyone fully mature in Christ." Colossians 1:28. Please do continue to pray for our fellowship, that we might grow together, maturing together and serve together well.

There are many more things we could highlight. Many encouraging stories and joyful times where we have seen God at work amongst us. Please do speak to us if you have any questions for us. # SEARCH COMMITTEEReport from<br/>Nigel HeathREPORTCraig Dyer

At the start of 2022, we relaunched our Search Committee (SC) alongside our newly appointed Interim Moderator, Nigel Heath.

A church profile, job description, view of our ministries, and flow chart based on precedent were used to guide the SC. The SC were much in prayer and actively encouraged the church to pray throughout the exploratory process. The SC agreed that only one person at a time should be considered.

During the search for a Senior Pastor (SP), preachers were invited for pulpit supply. Members of the SC noted feedback from the church. Early in the process, three men were shortlisted with a view to inviting one of them to speak at the invitation of the SC and meet with the SC for interview.

Early in 2022, with the strongest support received for Craig Dyer, he was approached to see if he would be willing to explore the possibility with HBC that God might be calling him to be the next SP. At this point, Craig, with with characteristic humility and deference, asked the SC to explore every option first in order to seek God's Will for HBC.

Having prayerfully considered, the SC agreed to approach Craig Dyer again, feeling God's leading throughout. Craig agreed to engage with the exploratory process. First, he met with the elders, and then agreed to speak at the invitation of the SC and meet with the committee for interview.

### SEARCH COMMITTEE REPORT Craig Dyer

The further the SC explored Craig's suitability as SP for HBC the more evident it became that he should be considered by the Church. His values are Christ-centred and preaching Word-centred. When asked about theological views, Craig proved to be congruent and consistent in his beliefs, profession, and ways of being. In chemistry we found him to be warm and gracious; in competence with a proven track record; in continuity, developing through reading, podcasts and conferences; in experience and capacity, having already served as a senior pastor and now handling the demands of a senior appointment with CEM. When asked about what gifts, skills and experience have enriched his ministry, Craig replied, "I have no spectacular gifts, but I believe the Lord has given me a deep, steady confidence in His Word and a love for His people. Over the years I have seen the Lord at work by His Spirit, through His Word in His church, changing lives, not least my own."

As the SC and church continued in prayer alongside Craig and Margaret, the overwhelming support and God's leading was clear and we decided to call Craig as Senior Pastor of HBC.

Craig has given three months' notice to Christianity Explored Ministries (CEM) and anticipates taking up his appointment at HBC sometime during September this year.


### Tell us a little about yourself:

### WHO WE ARE

At HBC we are so blessed and encouraged by the number of people who are both gifted and willing to serve in the Worship Team. Our worship, or praise team, comprises of over 40 people in various roles including service leaders, vocalists, musicians, sound technicians, powerpoint controllers, and live stream controllers. A lot of this team are also actively serving in other ministries in the life of HBC.

### THE ESSENCE OF WORSHIP

While the core focus of our ministry is the musical worship on a Sunday, we know and believe that worship is an act of devotion directed toward God. Worship is not about emotion, but a whole-life effort to bring glory to God in all we do. While the sung worship on a Sunday is only a small part of our everyday worship in how we express our faith in our lives, our worship on a Sunday is such an important part of our faith and an important time when we glorify our great God together.

### WHAT, WHO, WHY?

- What are Growth Groups? Essentially, they are home bible studies that take place every second Wednesday evening during school term. We also have 1 of our 9 groups meeting in the church.
- These groups are for everyone in the Church, members and adherents alike, who want to study God's word together in small groups, in a safe, secure and more intimate environment.
- We enjoy fellowship with one another, and the opportunity to build up and be built up by one another in our faith. We look to deepen our knowledge of God's word as it's written for us in the scriptures and how that pans out for us in our daily lives. We also have the opportunity to give and receive pastoral care as we listen and talk to one another. Many of the groups operate a WhatsApp group chat which makes keeping in touch easier.
- The average number who attend each group is around fourteen, but this can be very variable week by week, with some groups regularly having upwards of 15 and some with five or six. The geographical areas covered are; Strathaven, Larkhall, Motherwell, Bothwell, Blantyre, Earnock, Silvertonhill and central Hamilton.

### WHAT IS MESSY CHURCH?

Hamilton Baptist Messy Church began in February 2018 out of a desire to reach families in our surrounding area, and to provide an opportunity for church families to invite friends and neighbours to a church event.

We host a 2-hour event one Saturday per month which is free to attend, and includes a programme of food, stories, songs, crafts, games, activities and fun. The focus of each event is a Bible story or theme, and the activities and stories will all be centred around that theme.

We normally have 80-100 people attending Messy Church each month and use most of the church rooms/halls for various activities.

#### The Objectives of Messy Church are:

- To give people a warm welcome to a church building for many this is their first time in a church, or the first in a long time.
- To meet practical needs a free meal, a relaxed and safe environment, an opportunity to spend time as a family, or to chat to a friendly face.
- To introduce people to Jesus we might plant a seed, or water it a little, and our prayer is that people would see Jesus through the way we serve and the sharing of God's word in a simple way.

#### **POINTS OF THANKSGIVING**

- This year over 100 different children and adults have attended a Messy Church event.
- We thank God for the hundreds of families that came to Messy Church over the last 5 years and the connections that have been made- some leading to families now attending HBC or other churches.
- We give thanks for the committed team of over 30 people of all ages who make Messy Church happen each month it's rewarding work and a great opportunity to serve alongside each other.
- We are so grateful for our 'behind the scenes' team members who set up tables and chairs, and prepare lunch for us, and cut out crafts in advance.

#### **POINTS FOR PRAYER**

- Please pray that the team will make the most of every opportunity to share the Gospel with the people we meet at Messy Church.
- Please pray for God to work through this ministry, that people would see Jesus through the conversations, the connections, the activities.
- Please pray for team unity and stamina as we serve together and encourage each other.

Sunday School is a place where our children can learn biblical truths, and be nurtured by teachers and helpers who display the love of Jesus. It's for all kids aged 3 up to P7. ### **POINTS FOR PRAYER**

- Our prayer for the kids is that they come to know Jesus as their own saviour.
- This year we have faced a few challenges as we've tried to implement new material. For the year ahead, please pray for discernment as we look at the curriculum and how to move forward with this.
- We're looking to expand our team. Please pray that those within our church with a passion for working with children, who are skilled in teaching, and are willing and able to share their faith with our kids, are moved to get involved in this ministry.

# CRÈCHE







HBC Crèche caterers for children 0 – 3 years old. We have 21 children on the register, 12 of these children attend regularly. There are 23 volunteers who work on a 6-week rota. A couple of parents / guardians choose to stay in creche during the Sunday Morning Service with their children, this is personal choice. Crèche provision is 51 weeks of the year, Christmas Sunday each year there are toys laid out for parents who wish to take their children out of the Christmas Family Service. The Crèche is facilitated in the committee room.





# **BIBLE CLASS**

Bible Class does exactly what it says on the tin, it is a place for our S1-S3 teens to come and learn from the Bible. We meet during a Sunday morning service in the church flat.

### **PRAISE POINTS**

### POINTS FOR PRAYER

- The material we are using just now aligns with the Sunday School curriculum, and we are working our way through the Bible chronologically. Our prayer is that this way of working helps our teens to understand the big picture of the Bible and slot well known Sunday School stories into place in God's amazing plan.
- One of the longer term aims we have at Bible Class, is preparing our teens to join Sunday morning services. This ministry essentially acts as a bridge between Sunday school and Sunday morning services. Pray for our team as we look towards practical ways to equip our teens to integrate into our Sunday services.
- Our group of teens this year is small but faithful! Pray that the time they have in Bible Class is used wisely to educate, equip and build relationships that will enable them to walk boldly in their faith as they grow.

# YOUNG ADULTS



Our Young Adults group is for anyone aged 18-25. This is the first year this group has met formally. We usually meet around twice a month; once for a social, and once for a book study. The book we've been working through this year is called 'Confronting Christianity' by Rebecca McLaughlin. It has guided us through some really challenging questions and has opened up wonderful discussion around what it's like living as a young person in today's secular culture. We've also had some visitors from our church family attend the odd study to offer a different perspective, and share their wisdom with us.

### **PRAISE POINTS**

- We're thankful for the material that we've been using. McLaughlin pulls no punches when answering the tough questions. She is culturally sensitive while always putting the word of God at the forefront of her discussions.
- A few years ago at our youth weekend away we posed the question "are you ready to go and live your lives for God?" And the answer was a resounding no. As disheartening as that was to hear at the time, it was also an incredible opportunity to walk alongside this group. We are so thankful to God for His faithfulness to them. We're thankful for their engagement, and willingness to get involved in difficult conversations.
- We have had the privilege of being able to witness the grace and compassion with which this group tackle incredibly heavy conversations. Although Andrew and I "lead" young adults, we learn so much from those who attend. It is a privilege to walk through life shoulder to shoulder with this lot!

### **POINTS FOR PRAYER**

When discussing what this group would like to do next term, there was a strong desire for more study. #### YWAM ORLANDO

Nine years ago, Meghan Gregory, (who is the daughter of Ewan & Gail Stewart) began working with YWAM Orlando. At the beginning of 2023 she returned to Glasgow leading a team of young people aged 17-30 on a two-month missions trip, to serve local Baptist churches and surrounding communities.

Meghan shares with us here, how they found God at work in Scotland:

"When I was asked to lead a 2 month-long outreach to Scotland, I was initially apprehensive. What does outreach look like in Scotland, my home? I'd been a missionary with 'Youth With A Mission' based in Orlando for 9 years, but missions seemed more daunting in my own country. How would Scottish people react to the Gospel? Would they be closed off? Would they care?

The answer shocked me. I found a very different Scotland than the one I left 9 years ago: people were open spiritually, searching for meaning, hungry for prayer and above all, receptive to the gospel.

Me and my American team spent Jan and Feb doing evangelism on the streets of Glasgow, volunteering at food banks in Motherwell, serving my home church HBC, teaching English at Dennistoun Baptist and partnering with other ministries. We spent a lot of time out on the streets, sharing the gospel and offering prayer. So many people wanted to be prayed for! And every time we did, God's presence could be felt. We had countless conversations with people struggling in life and God always gave us the words to encourage them.

We returned to Orlando with too many stories like this to count. Our team wasn't anything special – a group of mixed ages, each at different places in our walk with God, but all eager to share His love and power with people. So don't believe the lie that Scotland is too far gone. People in Scotland are looking for God, they are open to the Gospel and they want prayer. It just takes us stepping out of our comfort zone, willing to be uncomfortable – because God is using simple obedience to change people's story."

Nevertheless, we felt that we had provided a worthwhile facility, and would look again to revisit this going into the winter months. 
- Alleviate pressure from our Leadership so that they might focus on where God is leading them. This also extends to helping our many ministries so that they can focus on what they do best!
